Tutor Learning Initiative

The Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) provides government schools with funding to employ tutors to deliver targeted small group learning support to students who need it most.

The focus of the TLI is on the foundational skills of literacy and numeracy, which are critical for success in school and life.

Students selected for support through TLI may have complex learning and other needs. Tutoring through TLI is intended to build upon and be integrated with existing supports as part of a whole-school approach to learning intervention.

Annual Consent Form and Collection Notice 2024

During the school year there are many occasions and events where staff may photograph, film or record students participating in school activities and events. We do this for many reasons including to for example: to celebrate student participation and achievement, showcase particular learning programs, document a student's learning journey/camps/excursions/sports events etc, communicate with our parents and school community in newsletters etc.

This notice and our Photographing, Filming and Recording Students Policy (available on the website) applies to photographs, video or recordings of students that are collected, used and disclosed by the school. We ask that any parents/carers or other members of our school community photographing, filming or recording students at school events (e.g., end of year celebrations, excursions/camps, sports events etc) do so in a respectful and safe manner and that any photos, video or recordings ("images" of students are not publicly posted (e.g., to a social media account) without the permission of the relevant parent/carer.

A. Use or disclosure within the school community

Unless you tell us otherwise below, images of your child may be used by our school within the school community, as described below.

This means that any images of your child taken by the school may constitute a collection of your child's personal information. The school is part of the Department of Education and Training (**the Department**). The Department values the privacy of every person and must comply with the *Privacy and Data Protection Act 2014* (Vic) when collecting and managing all personal information. Ownership and Reproduction

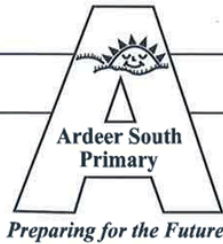
Copyright in the images will be wholly owned by the school. This means that the school may use the images in the ways described in this form without notifying, acknowledging or compensating you or your child.
