

#### G1 - 6 School Science Incursion - Science Play Kids - May 30th

In Week 6 we are very lucky to have a free science incursion visiting our school. This aligns with our Term 2 focus on Earth and Space science.

"Thinking like a scientist"

SciencePlay Kids explores science concepts and a STEM Mindset by incorporating creativity, play, tactile and sensory rich experiences and familiar materials to make approaching and engaging in science investigations possible for all types of learners. Dr. Loz from SciencePlay Kids has a PhD in Biochemistry & Molecular Biology. She's worked across the world, sent her experiments into space, and has two little scientists of her own. Dr. Loz has worked with 1000s of early years and primary aged children, engaging them in multi-sensory science explorations.


#### School Wide Positive Behaviour
