As always we continue to deliver a rigorous learning program despite our students being tired after a long term.


Attendance data has been outstanding, keep your children coming to school every day - only 10 school days to go!


37 schools have received funding and I was informed today that our application was successful. Straight from the email from Sarah Connolly MP is this quote:

# Language Learning at ASPS

We are undertaking a consultative process which is exploring our options for our language program at Ardeer South. It is a requirement that schools must provide a language program for students from Foundation to Year 10.

Our community is made up of students from various language backgrounds. I welcome you to have input into our commitment to a language program that benefits all students. Over the past few years we have had difficulties employing a long term teacher of Italian and we are now exploring options to teach Auslan as our additional language.

We have investigated the teaching of an Auslan program through engaging the services of Auslan Education Services and share the following information with you:

Learning Auslan is now incorporated into all kindergarten programs and has many benefits for both deaf and hearing children.

Sign language can:

- enhance children's educational and personal development
- increase memory retention and motion processing
- stimulate brain development and mental flexibility
- increase enjoyment in communicating for both hearing and deaf children.

# Benefits of learning Auslan include:

- development of neural pathways and cognitive processes unique to using a visual language
- capacity to communicate with peers, friends and family members who use Auslan
- improved capacity for visual-gestural communication
- intellectual interest, engagement and personal challenge
- opportunities for meaningful cross-curricular integration, for example through the use of information and communication technology (ICT)
- access to alternative ways of thinking and expressing ideas
- opportunities to develop and reinforce social justice values
- awareness of deafness as difference rather than as disability
- development of interpersonal skills, access to wider social networks and more diverse experience
- appreciation of the notions of Deafhood, cultural identity and community membership
- increased understanding of inclusion and diversity
- acquisition of a portable mode of communication that involves learning strategies for gesture that may have international, cross-cultural application

- increased understanding of language acquisition, language systems and learning processes
- enhanced development of overall literacy capabilities
- accessibility for some non-traditional learners, students with disability and those who are primarily visual learners.

As always I value community consultation and it is critical when we are considering replacing our existing language program with a program in a new language. This is your opportunity to provide feedback on a possible change of language. Speak to your child also about their preference. If you have not already done so please let the office know via the form that was sent home your preferred language. School Council will be making a decision regarding this next week.
